Course Description:

A weekly seminar course targeted at first-year students majoring in mathematics and actuarial science covering foundational techniques for learning both applied and theoretical mathematics with the goal of improving students' performance in courses taken during the first year.

Course Requirements and Evaluation:

Each class period will be worth 6% of your overall course grade and each reading assignment will be worth 7% of your overall grade (13 classes, 3 readings). The reading assignments will be graded based on the quality/thoughtfulness of your answers. Grades for class periods will be determined by the professor's evaluation of your engagement/participation.
