Course Description:

A weekly seminar course targeted at first-year students majoring in mathematics and actuarial science covering foundational techniques for learning both applied and theoretical mathematics with the goal of improving students' performance in courses taken during the first year.

Course Context/Goal:

This course is intended to support all of the Division of Mathematical Sciences Goals by helping the students develop the learning techniques necessary to effectively and efficiently learn mathematics throughout the remainder of their academic and professional careers.

This is a 0 credit, pass/fail course. A pass will require a course grade of at least 70%. Each assignment can earn up to 5 points, and assignments that are not submitted will receive **-1.5 points**. The assignments will be graded based on the quality/thoughtfulness of your answers.
