Using the AI tool of your choice, copy the following prompt into the tool. You can spend up to 20 minutes refining the response using AI. Record all prompts provided to the AI engine, and copy your final AI response into Word, and print it out.

Using a not-black pen, "grade" it (add comments and feedback in light of the assigned task as if it was a student submission and you were the professor).

Critique the response using the following thoughts: does the response reflect your own perspective? does the response reflect biblical principles accurately? are they biblically shallow or using proof texts? Are foundational issues articulated and addressed? or are answers superficial?

Grade the AI response using the provided rubric. Provide a $\frac{3}{4} - 1\frac{1}{2}$ page single-spaced summery of your perceived value of using AI to generate a response. Be sure to identify risks with using AI to generate material in a professional space in your summary.

Submit a clean pdf of the prompts and AI response with your feedback, a pdf of the scored rubric, and a pdf of your reflection/summary on the use of AI in Canvas.

You do not need to generate your own original response to the prompt below. You will be graded on the quality of your evaluation of the AI generated work and your reflection and consideration of the use of AI in this context.

Consider Key Ethical concerns Facing the Actuarial Profession published by the American Academy of Actuaries. Peruse the document and read through sections I-III carefully.

- Based on your review of the above document, your experience with content in your courses, and any other research you do into actuarial careers discuss the kinds of ethical issues you personally anticipate facing in the work place in contrast to your experience in education. $(\frac{1}{2} 1 \text{ page})$
